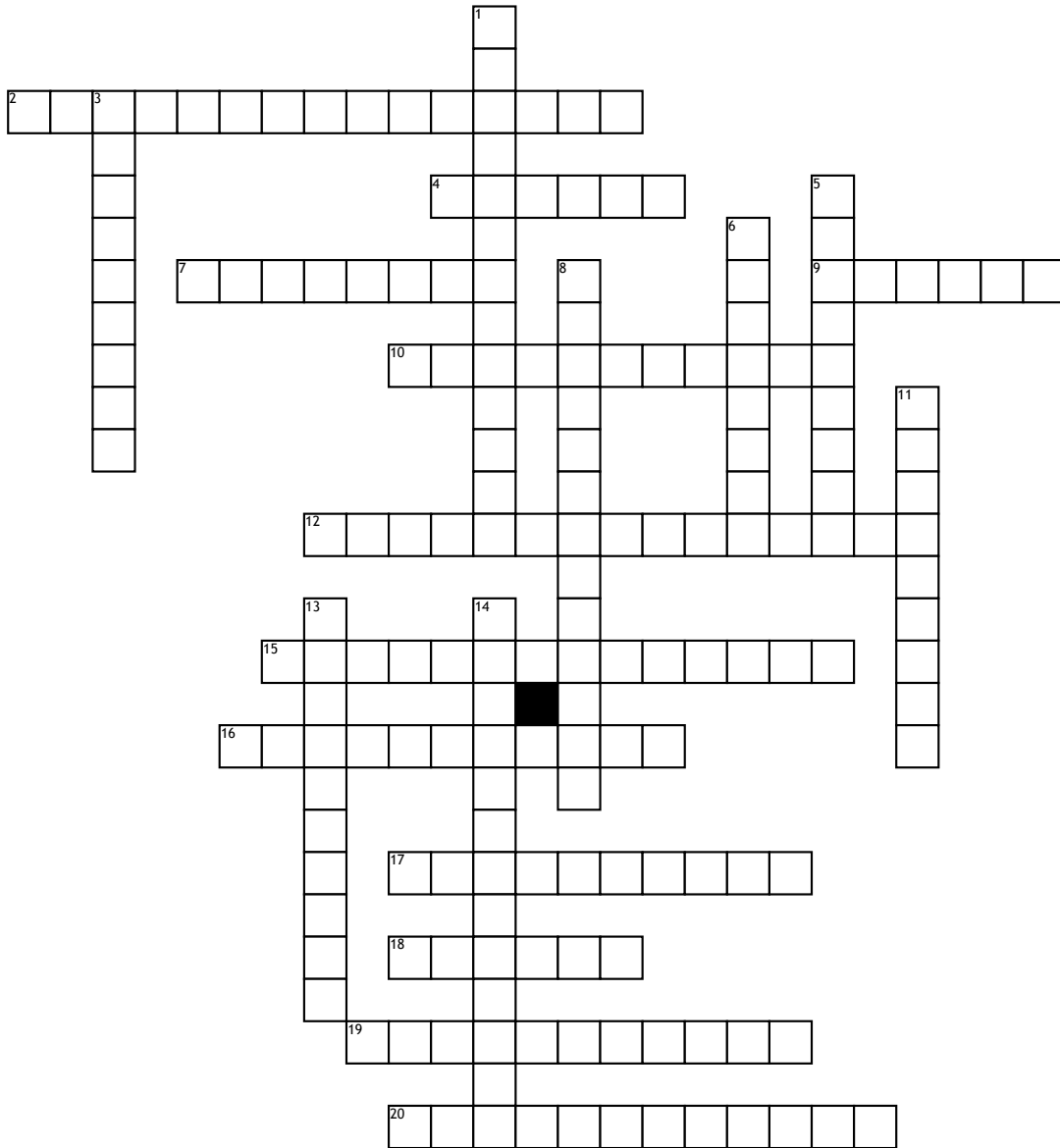

- 2. This intergovernmental organization lasted from 1919-1946, was founded after the Paris Peace Conference. It did not work effectively to prevent WWII.
- 4. In World War I, the nations of Great Britain, France, and Russia along with other nations that fought on their side
- 7. the blocking of a harbor by warships
- 9. a ditch dug and used by soldiers for protection
- 10. The belief that people should be loyal mainly to their nation—that is, to the people with whom they share a culture and history—rather than a king or empire.
- 12. Ruler of Germany during World War I who wanted to show how powerful the Germany military was.
- 15. A military alliance between Germany, Austria-Hungary, and Italy in the years preceding World War I

- 16. This term refers to the payments and transfers of property that Germany was required to make under the treaty of Versailles.
  - 17. A policy of glorifying military power and keeping a standing army always prepared for war
  - 18. This new machinery used by the Germans in sea warfare, to attack British and American supply ships in the North Sea and the Atlantic Ocean.
  - 19. A policy in which a strong nations seeks to dominate other countries politically, economically, or socially
  - 20. This was a major front in World War I. A line of trenches and fortifications in World War I that stretched without a break from Switzerland to the North Sea.

- 1. This alliance between Great Britain, France and Russia in the years before WWI

- 3. An agreement to stop fighting until later. ( this does not mean the conflict and war has ended)
- 5. a final demand to try and prevent conflict
- 6. A union or association formed for mutual benefit, especially between countries or organizations.
- 8. This was the president who was elected in 1912, and led the US into WWI. Later wrote a plan for post-WWI peace known as the Fourteen Points.
- 11. This British passenger ship was sunk by German U-boats in 1915, carrying civilians and ammunition to Britain from the U.S. The event turned American opinion against Germany.
- 13. Information of material spread to advance a cause to damage an opponent's cause
- 14. This was a major alliance at the 'center' of Europe during World War I, made up of Germany, Austria-Hungary, Bulgaria, and Ottoman Empire. It was formerly known as the Triple Alliance before the war.
