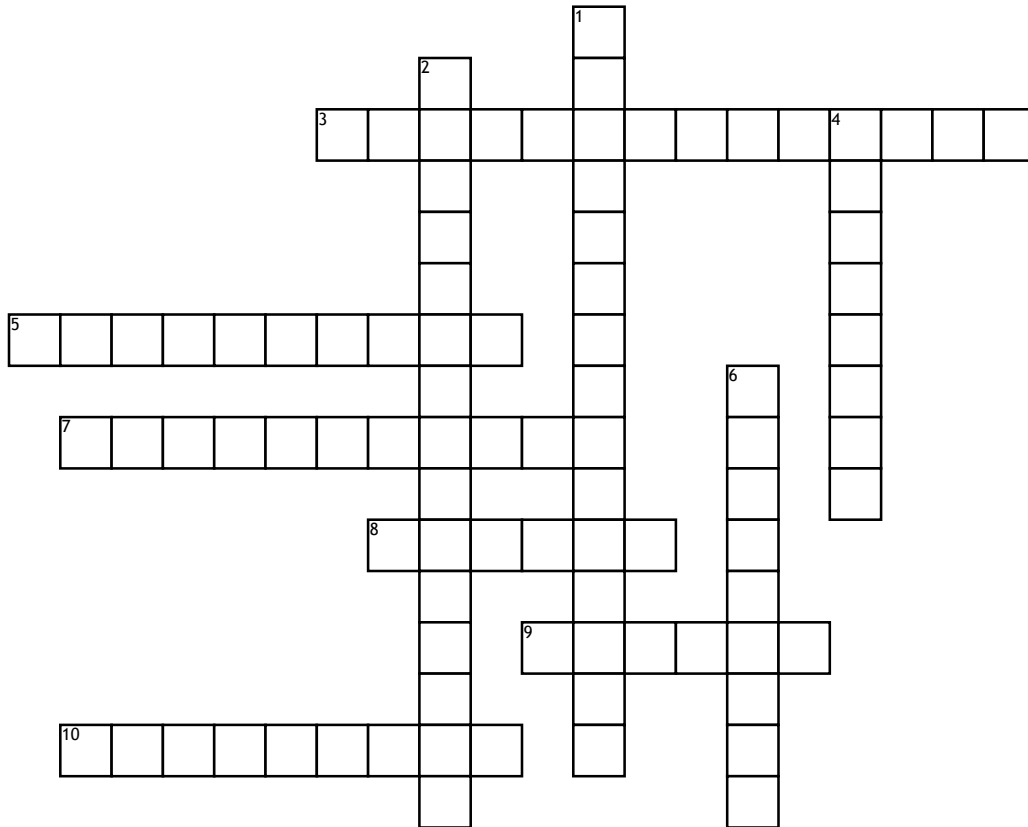

- 3. World War II naval battle, fought almost entirely with aircraft, in which the United States destroyed Japan's first-line carrier strength and most of its best trained naval pilots.
- 5. an American B-29 bomber dropped the world's first deployed atomic bomb over the Japanese city of Hiroshima
- 7. An inlet of the Pacific Ocean on the southern coast of Oahu, Hawaii, west of Honolulu. It became the site of a naval base after the United States annexed Hawaii in 1898.
- 8. It is an ancient, monotheistic, Abrahamic religion with the Torah as its foundational text.
- 9. a German politician, demagogue, and Pan-German revolutionary. He was leader of the Nazi Party, and rose to power in Germany as Chancellor in 1933 and Führer in 1934.

- 10. the mass murder of Jews under the German Nazi regime during the period 1941-45. More than 6 million European Jews, as well as members of other persecuted groups, such as gypsies and homosexuals, were murdered at concentration camps such as Auschwitz.

- 1. Americans endured the greatest economic crisis in the nation's history--at its worst, more than a quarter of the work force was unemployed.
- 2. During the "Roaring Twenties", the U.S. economy and the stock market experienced rapid expansion, and stocks hit record highs.
- 4. a period of severe dust storms that greatly damaged the ecology and agriculture of the American and Canadian prairies during the 1930s
- 6. Passed on March 11, 1941, this act set up a system that would allow the United States to lend or lease war supplies to any nation deemed "vital to the defense of the United States."
