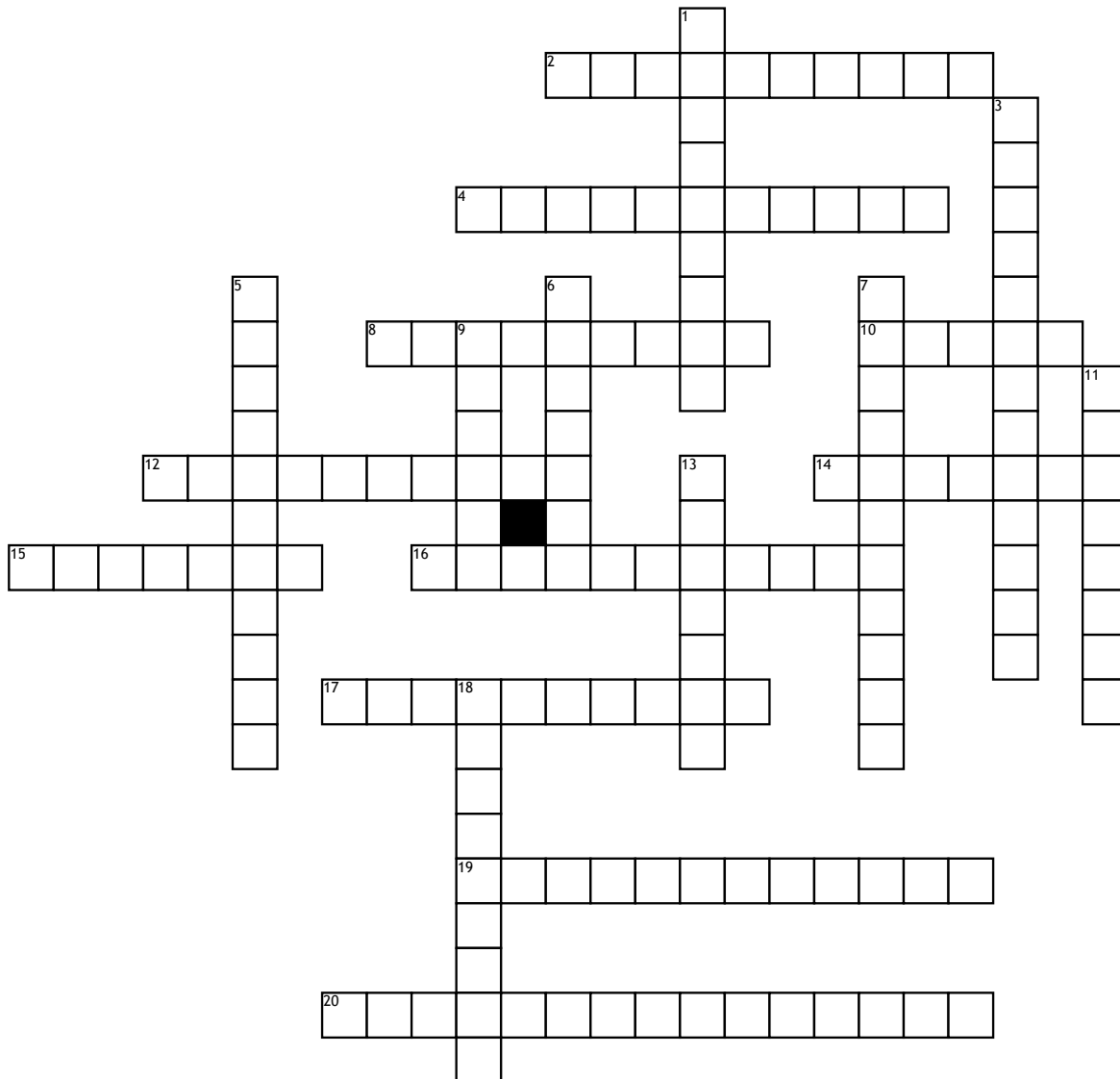


# Week 4 Review (ch. 24 & 25)



## Across

2. primary source of body heat  
 4. abnormal cardiac rhythm  
 8. dyspnea in which breathing is easier when the patient sits/stands  
 10. absence of breathing  
 12. body temp, pulse, resp. rate, blood pressure; need these to establish baseline on admission  
 14. difficult or labored breathing  
 15. lung sounds that are musical/ squeaky, high-pitched, and auscultated on inhalation/ exhalation

16. heart rate that falls below 60bpm

17. purposeful/ systematic observation; done before listening and touching

19. listening for sounds within the body

20. sounds that correspond to changes in blood flow through an artery; you hear these when taking a BP

1. respiratory rate above >20

3. assessment done on admission; initial

5. decreased body temperature

6. assessment for a specific spot/ issue

7. heart rate >100bpm

9. tension of the skin determined by its hydration

11. lung sounds that bubble/pop, low-to-high pitched when auscultated; air passing through fluid in the airways

13. The \_\_\_\_\_ Coma scale is used to assess level of consciousness

18. feeling a part of the body with fingers/hand
