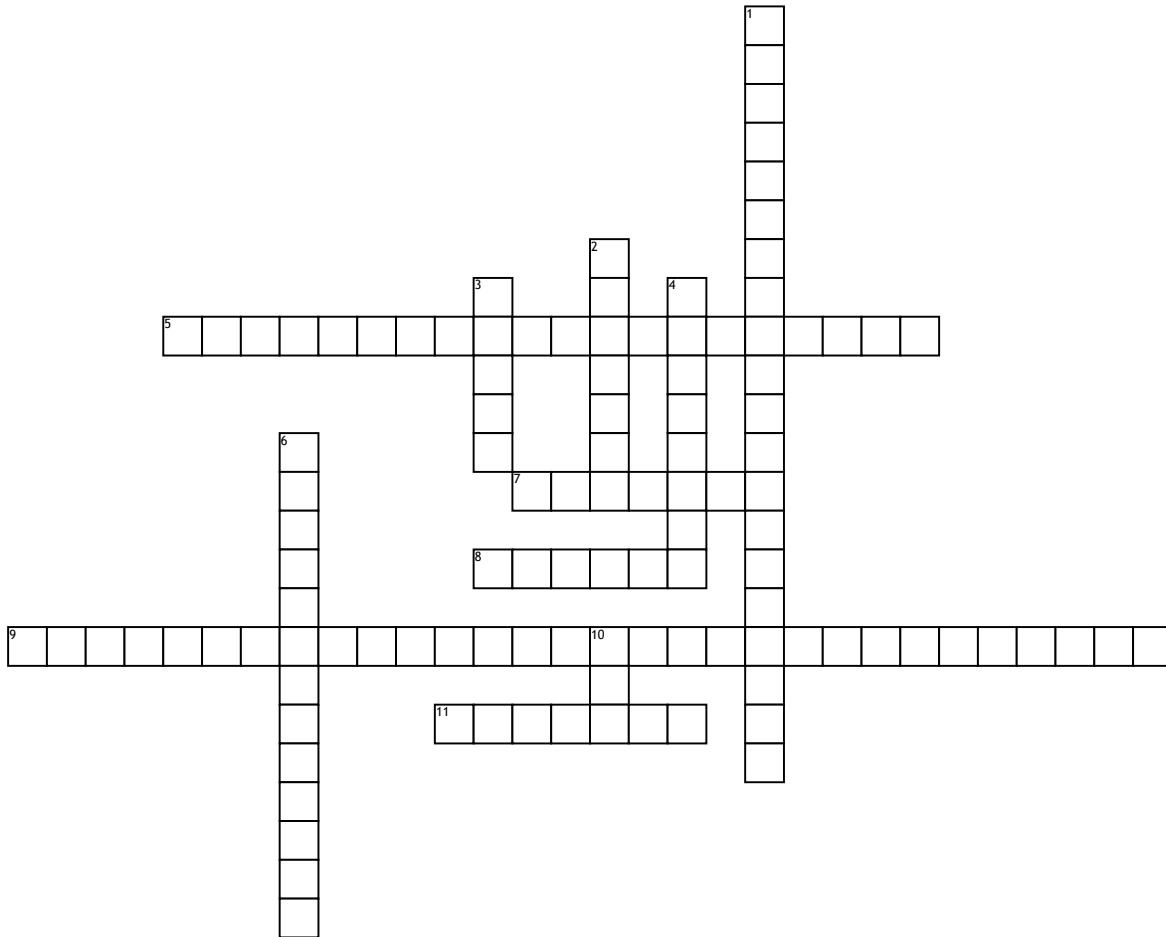


What is that test for?

5. Associated with infections of the mucous membranes of the urogenital system, upper respiratory system and the eye. Can be sexually transmitted.
7. Quantitative analysis measures urinary risk factors for kidney stone formation.
8. Aid in the diagnosis of carbohydrate malabsorption.
9. Useful in diagnosing gluten-sensitive enteropathies, such as Celiac Disease and dermatitis herpetiformis.
11. Produced in the pancreas. Increased levels may be due to inflammation of the pancreas.

1. VMA is useful in diagnosing neuroblastoma, one of the most common tumors in the pediatric population.
2. A disease detected by skin scraping to detect itch mites.
3. Assay used to monitor patients with ovarian cancer.
4. Also known as Vitamin B1. Deficiency in this vitamin is usually caused by alcoholism or chronic illness. In the early stages patients exhibit anorexia, irritability, and generalized weakness.
6. Elevated levels occur in patients with impaired oxygen delivery to tissues. Seen in patients with anemia, and secondary polythemia vera.
10. Antibodies present in Systemic Lupus, Erythematosus, Sjorgren's Syndrome, Scleroderma, Liver Disease and Rheumatoid Arthritis.
