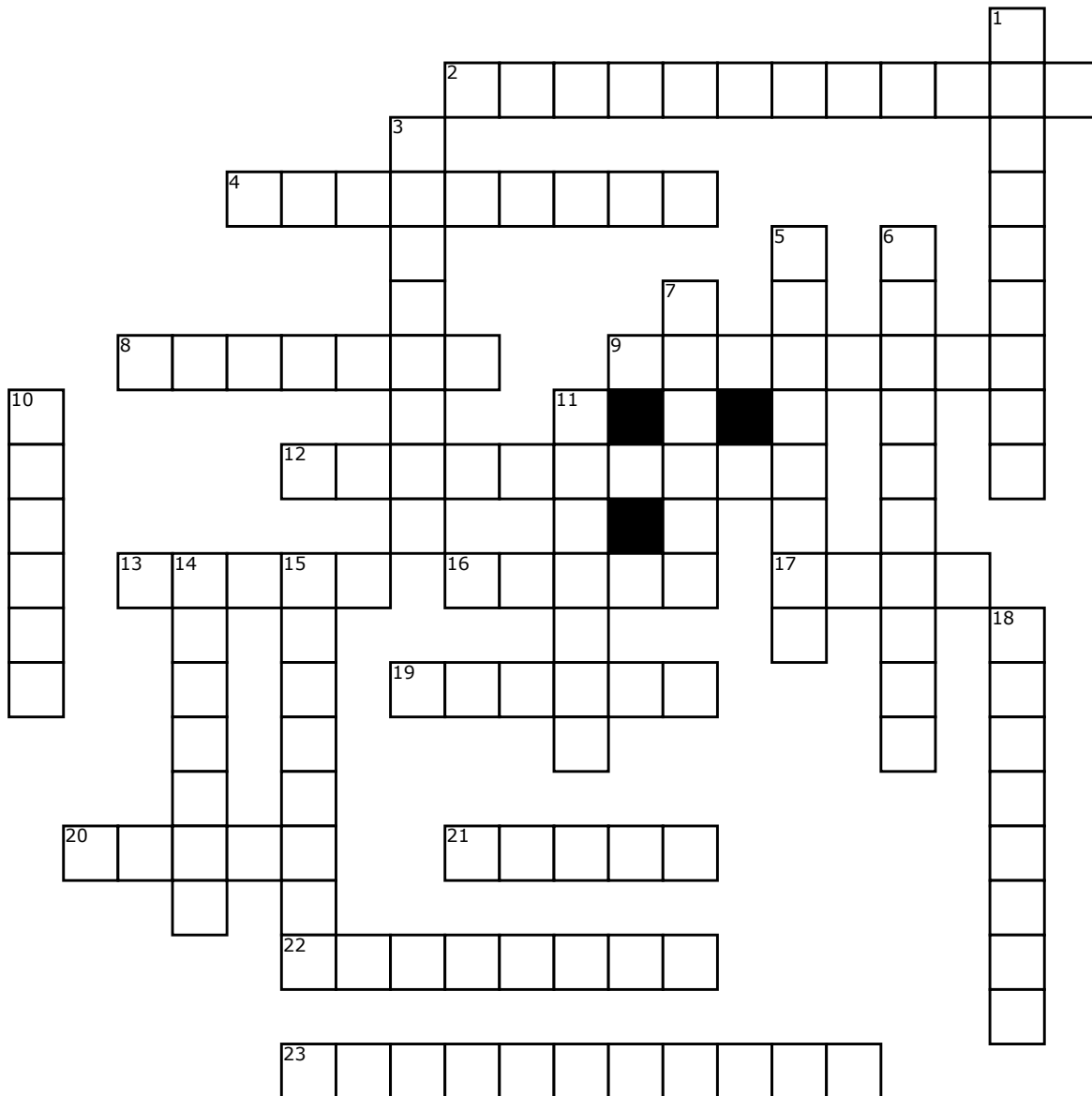


# With Malice Crossword
