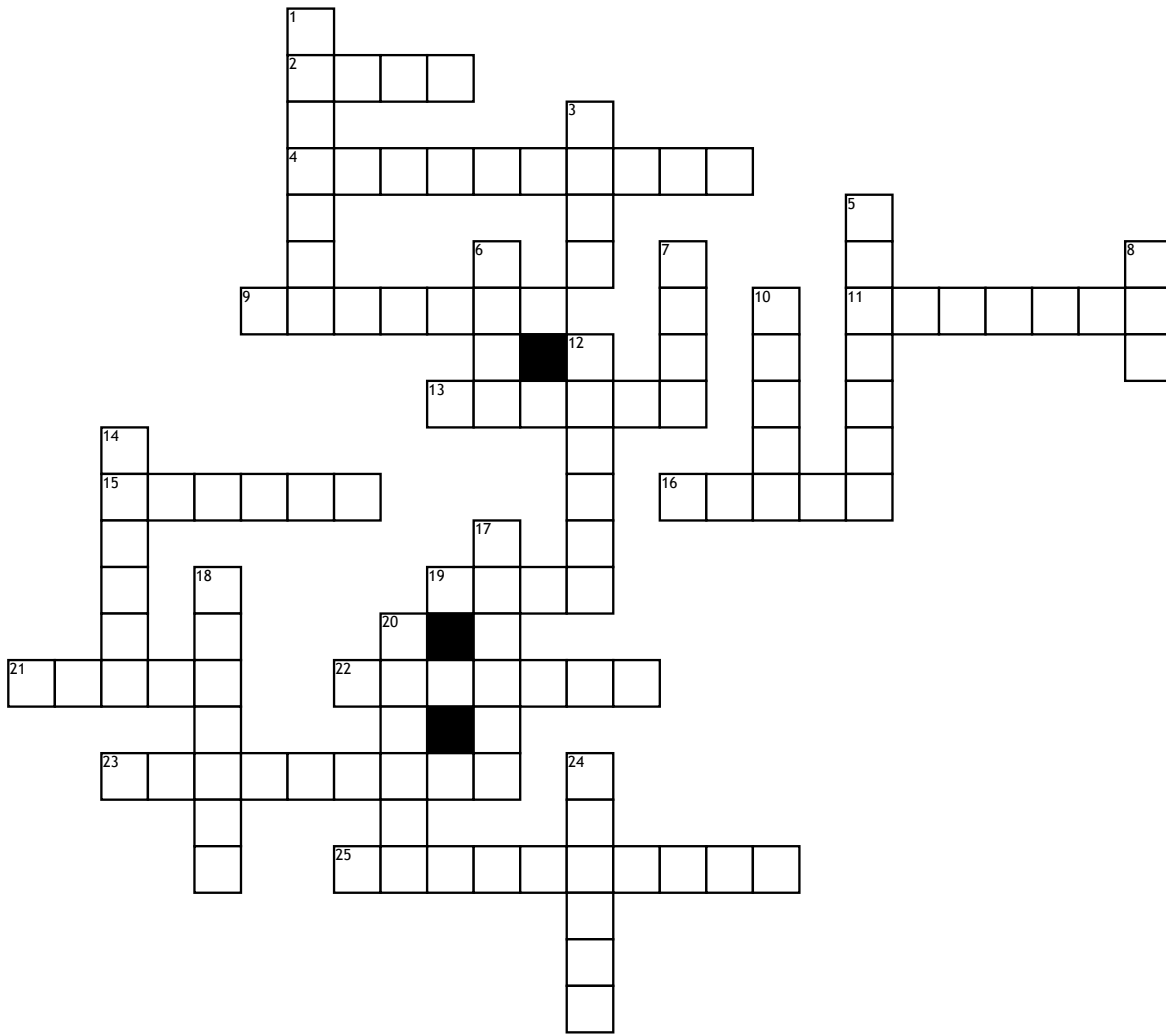


Women of the Classical Age
