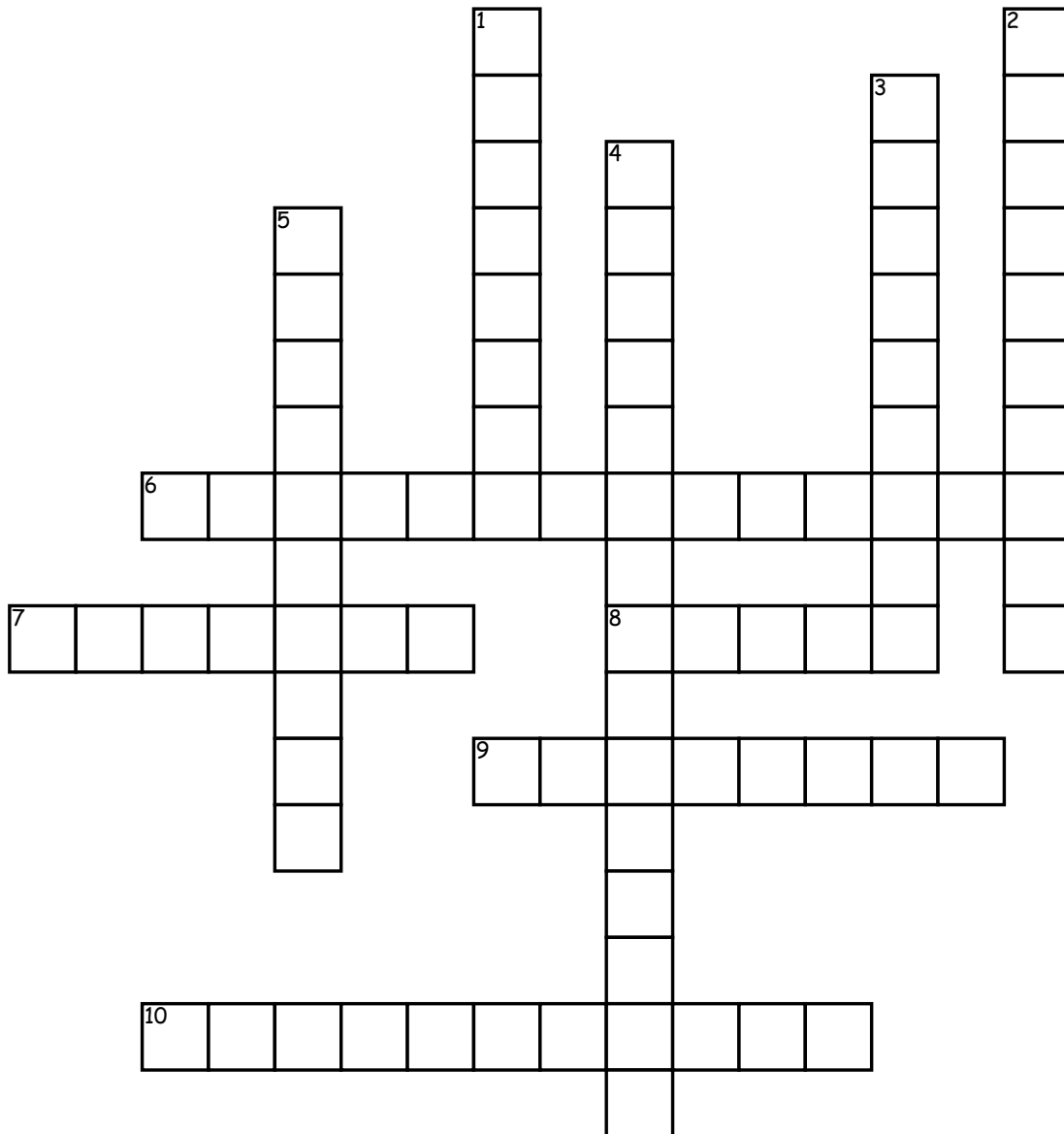


# Word Play
