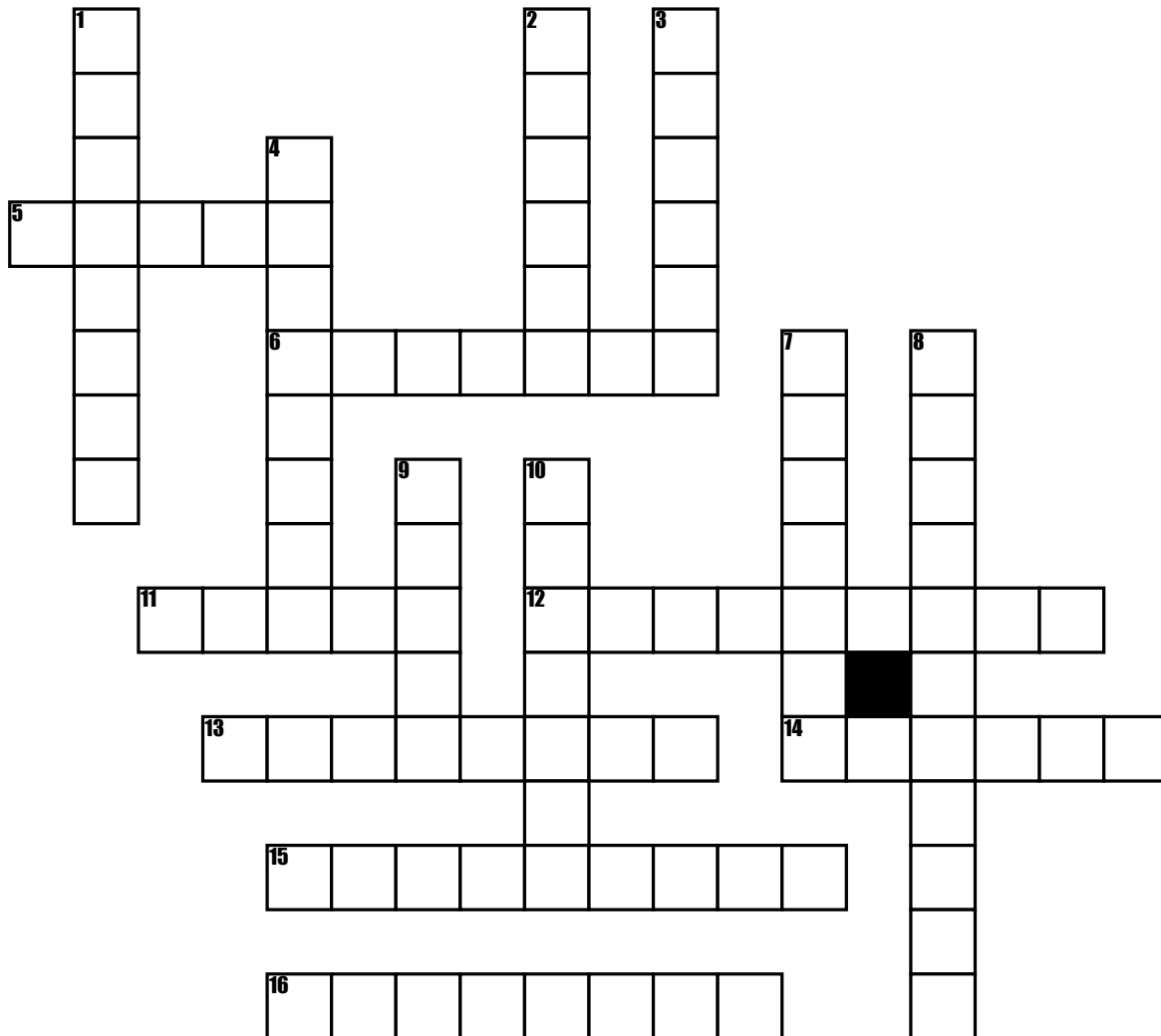


Yearbook Terms Crossword

6. A page or double-page spread that separates different sections of the book

16. Arrangement of opposite or differing images in size, color, etc. to attract attention or place emphasis

1. A master page that maintains consistency within a design or section.

2. Two facing pages in a publication.

3. A chart representing the pages in a signature or a book, used for planning book sections, page content and color placement.

4. Is always at the top of the page in large font to provide the subject of the spread

8. Keeping the same font and design principles throughout a yearbook

9. a picture that extends beyond the margin of the page, extending off the page
