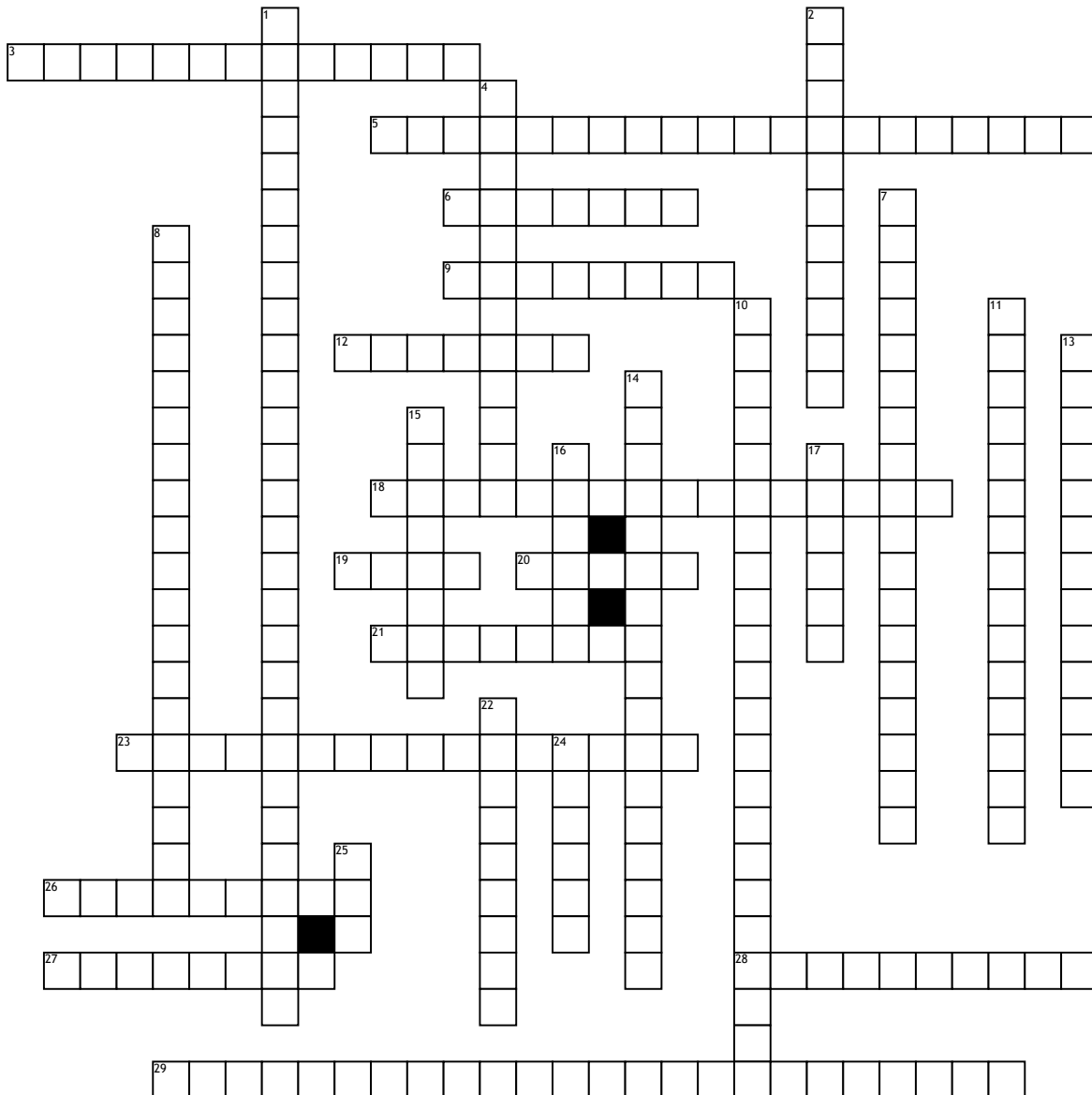

- 3. Pay check is automatically put into your bank account
- 5. Issued at birth, this is your official government identification
- 6. Usually attached to employee's check, this explains net income, deductions and gross income
- 9. Non-wage compensation given to employees
- 12. Money saved by company for employee's retirement
- 18. Tax paid to the federal government deducted from every paycheck. Amount depends on income level and filing status
- 19. How much someone is paid per hour
- 20. Pay given to employees
- 21. Someone hired by a company to perform tasks
- 23. Money taken out before taxes to pay for child care expenses

- 26. By law, employees working more than 40 hours per week receive overtime equal to at least hourly wage times 1.5

- 27. the amount employee earns
- 28. anything subtracted from gross pay
- 29. Money taken from Gross Pay to pay for employee's health insurance

- 1. Account employee puts untaxed pay in until medical expenses are incurred throughout the year.
- 2. Hired by individuals or companies to provide goods/tasks under contract
- 4. Deduction to pay for elderly's health care
- 7. Deduction to pay for retiree's income from the government
- 8. Employee is paid every other week (26 checks a year)
- 10. Employee is paid twice a month (24 checks a year)

- 11. Set by the company, defines when employees will be paid and what time period will be covered by the paycheck
- 13. Hired by contractors to perform tasks as outlined by contractor's contract
- 14. Voluntary deductions to pay for retirement in plans such as a 401(k) and 403(b)
- 15. After employee works 40 hours, extra time is paid 1 1/2 times regular hourly pay
- 16. a fixed regular payment to employee (same money no matter how many hours are worked)
- 17. the amount employee receives from employer
- 22. The amount of time covered on a paycheck
- 24. By law, employees do not receive overtime compensation due to being paid a salary
- 25. Year to Date - so far this year
