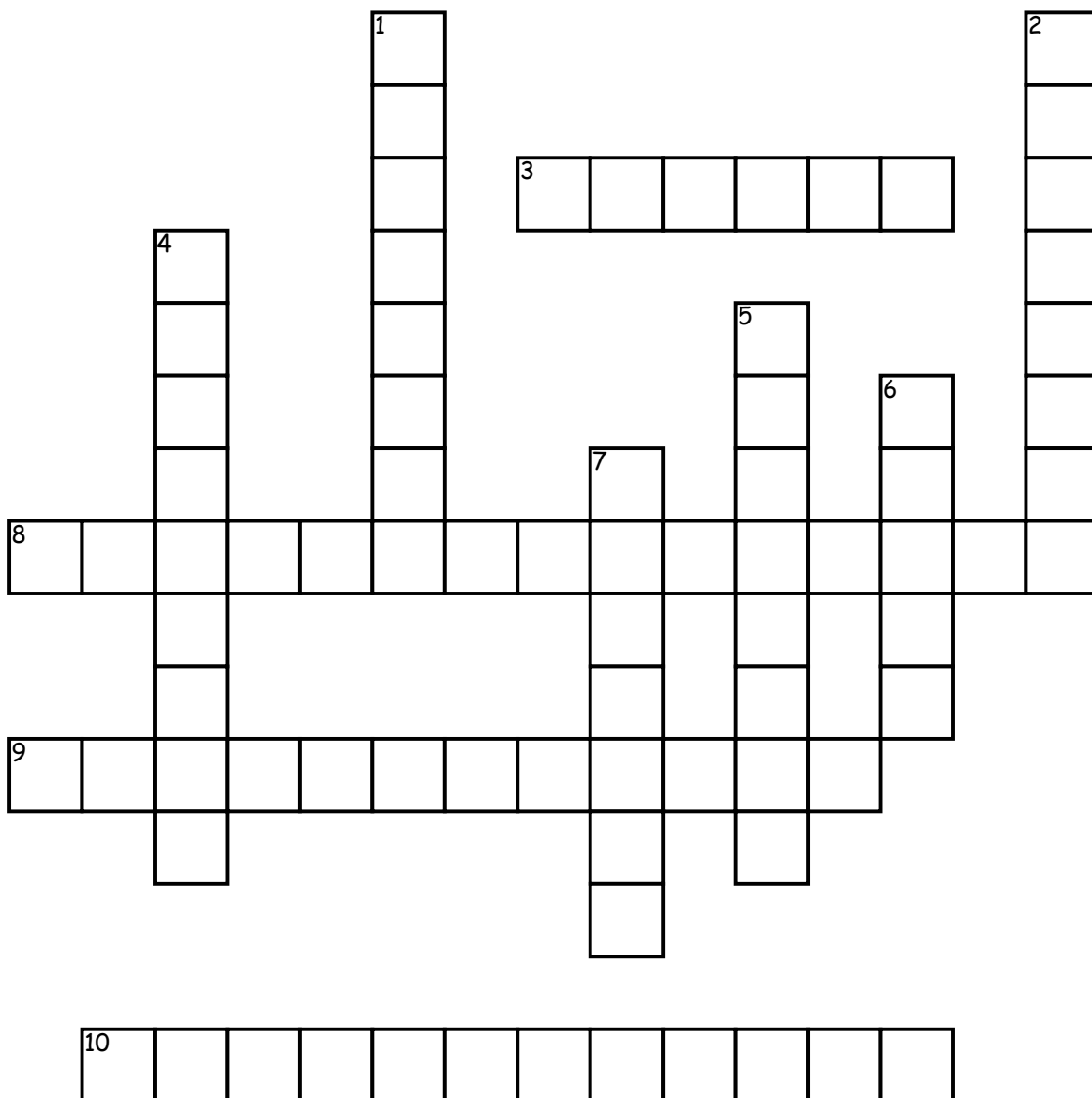

1. is a description using two opposite ideas to create an effective description. The format is often an adjective preceded by a noun.
2. a reference to a well-known person, place, thing or event of historical, cultural or literary merit
4. an over-exaggeration used to emphasize an emotion or description. Sometimes hyperbole also implements the use of simile and comparative words.
5. comparison without using the comparative words "like" or "as."
6. commonly used expression that has acquired a meaning different from its literal meaning.
7. figures of speech that use understatement to make a point. It is often sarcastic in tone. The statement is affirmed by negating the opposite.
