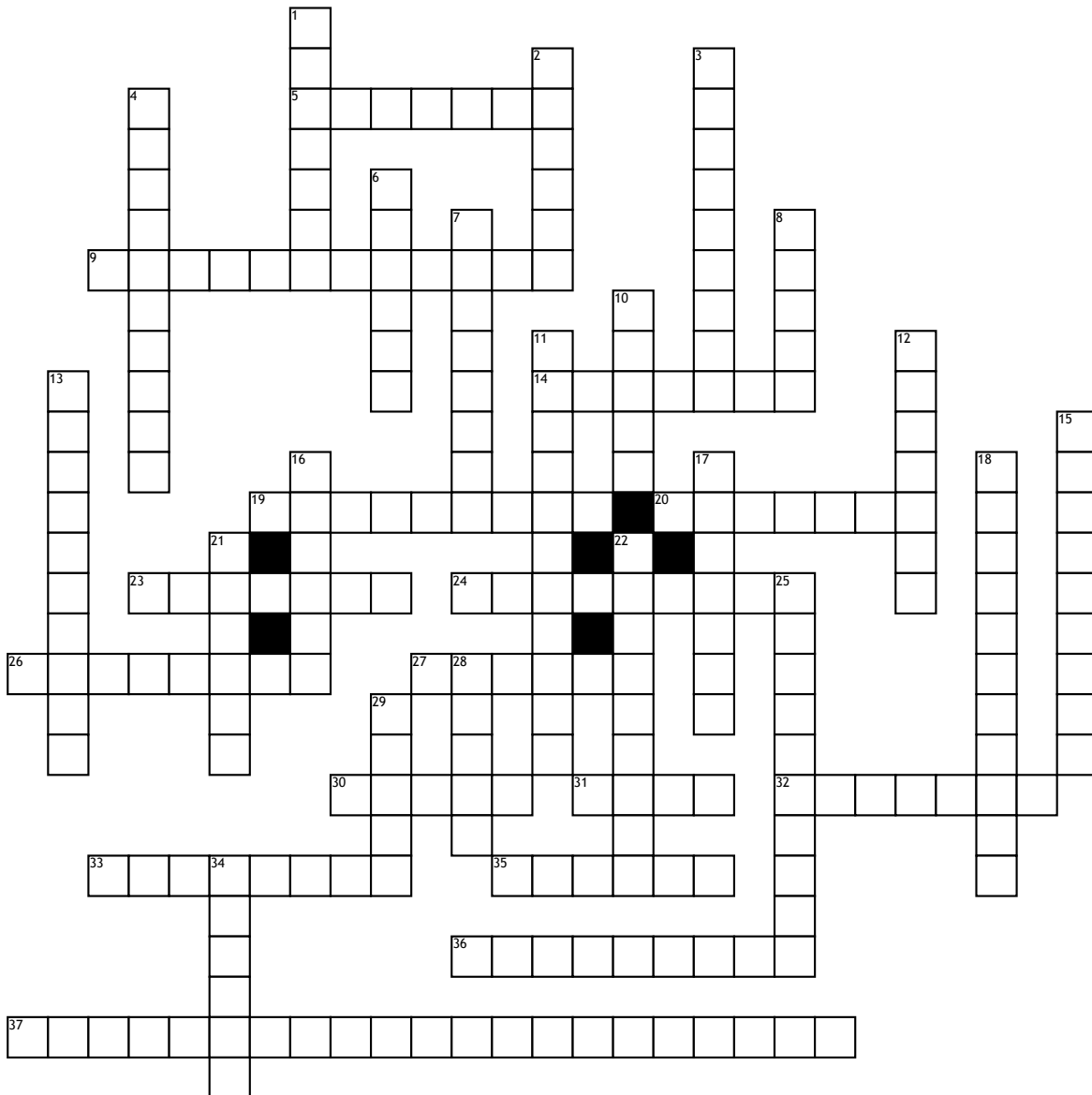

- 5. feeling of general discomfort or uneasiness that is often first indication of an infection or disease
- 9. localized response to an injury or to the destruction of tissues
- 14. a word formed from the initial letter of the major parts of a compound term
- 19. prediction of the probable course and outcome of a disorder
- 20. abnormal passage, usually between two internal organs or leading from an organ to the surface of the body
- 23. fluid, such as pus, that leaks out of an infected wound
- 24. identification of a disease
- 26. the process of reaching a diagnosis
- 27. having the nature, properties, or qualities of an adult male
- 30. the fluid secreted by these mucous membranes
- 31. objective evidence of a disease such as a fever

- 33. set of the signs and symptoms that occur together as part of a specific disease process
 - 35. a disease, structure, operation, or procedure named for the person who discovered or described it first
 - 36. can be evaluated or measured by the patient or others
 - 37. an attempt to determine which one of several diseases can be causing the signs and symptoms that are present

- 1. subjective evidence of a disease such as pain or a headache
 - 2. pathologic change of the tissue due to disease or injury
 - 3. examination technique in which the examiner's hands are used to feel the texture, size, consistency, and location of certain body parts
 - 4. the act of rotating the arm so that the palm of the hand is forward or upward
 - 6. means wound or injury. these are the types of injuries that might occur in an accident, shooting, natural disease, or fire
 - 7. left side

- 12. condition in which one or more body parts are not functioning normally
