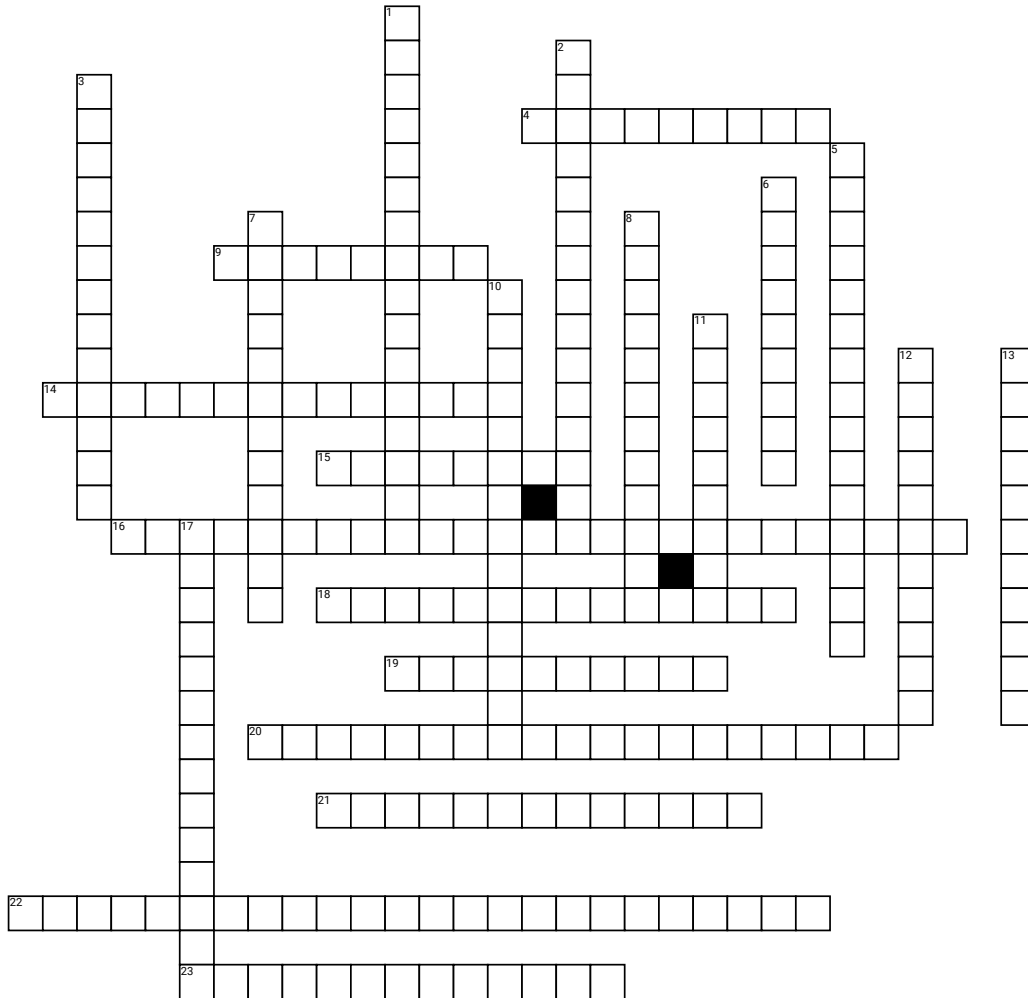


# people of the american revolution

- 4. served as a diplomat in Europe and helped negotiate the Treaty of Paris
- 9. was a Boston-born political leader who played a vital role in moving colonial America to its decisive break with Britain during the American Revolution.
- 14. was an American military officer who served as a general during the American Revolutionary War
- 15. known as Revolutionaries, Continentals, Rebels, or American Whigs
- 16. Congress was a meeting of delegates from the Thirteen Colonies in America which united in the American Revolutionary War. It convened on May 10, 1775
- 18. was an enslaved African American who served the Continental Army during the American Revolutionary War under the Marquis de Lafayette.
- 19. He is best known for his midnight ride to alert the colonial militia in April 1775 to the approach of British forces before the battles of Lexington and Concord
- 20. was a French aristocrat and military officer who fought in the American Revolutionary War

- 21. sailed from the Delaware River in February 1776 aboard Alfred on the Continental Navy's maiden cruise.
  - 22. was a meeting of delegates from 12 of the 13 British colonies that became the United States
  - 23. colonial protest group created by Samuel Adams, in Boston, Massachusetts. The group had the motto "No Taxation, without Representation".

- 1. commander in chief of the Continental Army during the American Revolutionary War and led the colonial forces to victory over the British and became a national hero.
  - 2. was a delegate to the Second Continental Congress from 1775 to 1776, when he drafted the Declaration of Independence.
  - 3. King of Great Britain and Ireland during the American
  - 5. was a political writer and propagandist of the American Revolution.
  - 6. American colonists who remained loyal to the British Crown during the American Revolutionary War

- 7. he served as the first and sixth post-colonial Governor of Virginia, from 1776 to 1779 and from 1784 to 1786.
- 8. the first First Lady to live in what would become the White House.
- 10. was an English general who fought in the Seven Years' War and served as a member of Parliament
- 11. Ideological Origins of the American Revolution. In his enormously renowned political theory, presented the idea of governmental checks and balances
- 12. An English American writer and pamphleteer whose "Common Sense" and other writings influenced the American Revolution, and helped pave the way for the Declaration of Independence.
- 13. He helped to draft both the Declaration of Independence and the Constitution of the United States.
- 17. was an American stevedore of African and Native American descent, widely regarded as the first person killed in the Boston Massacre
